## **INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS**

**Text:** Articles are accepted in Spanish or English. The text should be written in A4 (210x297 mm), with wide right margin. If accepted, and after last corrections the text and all figures and tables must be sent by e-mail, or by air-mail in a CD-ROM or DVD-ROM. Formats: text in RTF (rich text format) or Word (.doc).

The title of the article, the name(s) of the author(s) and their postal adresses, electronic mail and filiations must be in the first page. The text should be paginated including the title page. The title, as short as possible, should have indication of the studied geographic area. In manuscripts on Stratigraphy and Palaeontology an indication of the age of the studied material should be included. An concise abstract condensing the obtained results must be included from the first page. The text should be written in lower case characters, using capital characters in main titles or chapter titles and at the beginning of each line. Bibliographic references in the main text should be as follows: Aguirre (1984); Dommergues & Meister (1995); Naruto et al. (1989). Foot-notes are not accepted. It will only be admitted the use of the International System. Authors of palaeontological manuscripts must follow the International codes of nomenclature of Zoology and Botany. Type specimens figured must be stored in an official, permanent institution, and colection numbers must be cited with the corresponding abbreviations. Abbreviations for indication of new taxa proposed would be in the form: n. sp., n. gen., n. fam. In references all throughout the text the numbering in Roman numbers must be transformed to Arabic. Examples:
