

INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

Text: Articles are accepted in Spanish or English. The text should be written in A4 (210x297 mm), with wide right margin. If accepted, and after last corrections the text and all figures and tables must be sent by e-mail, or by air-mail in a CD-ROM or DVD-ROM. Formats: text in RTF (rich text format) or Word (.doc).

The title of the article, the name(s) of the author(s) and their postal addresses, electronic mail and filiations must be in the first page. The text should be paginated including the title page. The title, as short as possible, should have indication of the studied geographic area. In manuscripts on Stratigraphy and Palaeontology an indication of the age of the studied material should be included. An concise abstract condensing the obtained results must be included from the first page. The text should be written in lower case characters, using capital characters in main titles or chapter titles and at the beginning of each line. Bibliographic references in the main text should be as follows: Aguirre (1984); Dommergues & Meister (1995); Naruto et al. (1989). Foot-notes are not accepted. It will only be admitted the use of the International System. Authors of palaeontological manuscripts must follow the International codes of nomenclature of Zoology and Botany. Type specimens figured must be stored in an official, permanent institution, and collection numbers must be cited with the corresponding abbreviations. Abbreviations for indication of new taxa proposed would be in the form: n. sp., n. gen., n. fam. In references all throughout the text the numbering in Roman numbers must be transformed to Arabic. Examples:

1873 *Aspidoceras Beckeri* n. sp. - Neumayr: 202, pl. 18: 3.

1925 *Garantiana conjugata* Quenstedt. - Bentz: 162, pl. 6: 5-6.

Bibliographic references: It will be exhaustive and exclusive of those cited in the text or figure captions. Citations of a same author in the same year are distinguished as follows: Pasotti (1977a, 1977b). Other citations in the list of references:

Figures: All illustrations are introduced in the form of figures, consecutively numbered in the order of citation through the text. They must be independent and with an informative caption. Position of figures in text will be suggested by a mark in the left margin of the manuscript. Every figure must be of high quality and ready for eventual direct copy by scanning. The maximum size for full page figures is 170x247 mm, and for one column wide is 82x247 mm. The journal does not include folded pages (for these cases see possibilities below in Supplementary digital material MSD). In figures which need indication of scale it will be done in graphic form in the figure and explained in its caption. Parts of a figure will be identified with capital letters and subindicated by numbers if different views are presented (see examples in a recent volume of the Boletín IFG). All figures must be sent to the editors in their final form in digital support. Formats: TIFF, BMP, PSD (not JPG), 600 dpi for gray and color; 1200 dpi for line art. Color figures are usually accepted but in a number to be defined by the editor; for special cases when it is absolutely necessary the authors need to contact the editors previously of submitting their manuscripts.

Print proofs will be sent to the corresponding, or first author if not indicated, for correction of production errors. Usually there will be not accepted changes. The print proofs must be sent back to the editorial within the 15 days after reception.

Submission of manuscripts: preferently by e-mail to: ifg@fceia.unr.edu.ar.

(1) Text, tables, appendices and figure captions all, and in that order as a single file (formats: ".rtf" or ".doc").

(2) All figures (only kind of illustration used in the Boletín IFG) in a single Adobe Acrobat file (".pdf"). Accepted manuscripts must be resubmitted along with all the figures in high-quality bit-maps of exact final size (at least 600 dpi for color or gray and 1200 dpi for artline).

Supplementary digital (online) material (MSD): The authors could include, in digital form, additional information pertinent to the content of the article. MSD will be available at the web site of the Boletín del IFG associated with the corresponding article. There may be included as MSD:

(1) Color and/or larger figures than in the print version. Suggested formats: TIFF, BMP, JPG, PDF.

(2) Large and/or long tables. Suggested formats: *.xls, *.doc, *.pdf.

(3) Informatic programs created by the authors. They must be sent compressed as *.zip or *.rar.

(4) Additional lists of literature, published or unpublished, not referred in the article. Suggested formats: *.pdf, *.doc, *.txt.

Other material not listed can be considered by the editors.

The MSD must be sent by e-mail or, if larger than 30 MB, in CD-ROM or DVD-ROM, with the manuscript once accepted for publication. The editors will decide if possible to publish.

The MSD can be cited in the article but not for supporting conclusions.
